Updated COVID-19 Mitigation Procedures

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Families:

As the week draws to a close, I want to share two important changes to our school system's COVID-19 response, both beginning Monday, February 21, 2022.

School Exclusions for Students and School Employees in Grades K-12

On Thursday, February 10, 2022, the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services announced a significant change to the *StrongSchoolsNC Public Health Toolkit (K-12)*. That change <u>eliminates</u> the requirement for schools to exclude students and school employees in grades kindergarten through twelve on the basis of **exposure** to COVID-19. Earlier today, the *ChildCareStrongNC Public Health Toolkit* was also revised to reflect the same change for students and school employees in all prekindergarten settings.

Under those new guidelines, persons who are **diagnosed** with COVID-19 and persons who demonstrate **symptoms** of COVID-19 must still be excluded from school, but **exposure** to COVID-19 no longer requires exclusion. The new guidelines **do not** distinguish between exposure *settings*, *vaccination status*, or the use (or nonuse) of *face coverings*. Exclusion from school based on exposure to COVID-19 is no longer required regardless of those factors. That change begins statewide on Monday, February 21, 2022.

Face Coverings Within the School Environment

During a specially-called meeting earlier this evening, the Rutherford County Board of Education changed its local policy regarding the use of face coverings within the school environment. Beginning Monday, February 21, 2022, face coverings are **optional** for students, school employees, and visitors to all Rutherford County Schools facilities, both

indoors and outdoors, except as otherwise required by federal orders governing **school buses** and **Head Start programs**.
